

horses on platforms with wheels are lesser known. They were meant to be pulled by a child while his/her teddy bear rode on its back.



in regions of Germany.


Wilhelm Füchtner, called the "father of the nutcracker," started commercial

his Christmas hit, "Frosty the Snowman." Don't miss out on this great Christmas tradition and then warm up inside with some hot tea!




## **Kissing Under the Mistletoe**

of hot tea!






### Santa Claus
